The Challenge

Low Revenue Limits

- ◆ A 1993 state law limits the amount of money school districts can receive from state aid and local property taxes. This is called the "revenue limit."
- ◆ Deerfield's revenue limit per student is the <u>lowest</u> among neighboring school districts and at the <u>lowest</u> level in the state.
- Our low revenue limit makes it difficult to attract and retain quality staff as well as maintain current student programs and services.


